As part of the Expo competition requirements, each team must complete the Team Portfolio Report (formerly Team Data Sheet) to be eligible to compete. This form allows us to compile the data to track the progress of our teams across the globe. This form has been edited this year to align with the Project Charter and the Project Report (global requirement). This card has been developed to notify teams of changes to ensure they're able to work through the report easier.

There are a few sections I want to highlight and make sure you're aware of changes/updates. Sections include:

PROJECT INFORMATION:

- United Nations 17 Sustainable Development Goals
 - This year, we will ask you to list the category or categories from the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals with which your project aligns. Here is the overview of the goals:
- **Goal 1 – End Poverty**: End poverty in all its forms everywhere. Projects included providing new jobs, assisting entrepreneurs, reducing debt, etc.
- **Goal 2 – Zero Hunger**: End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture.
- **Goal 3 – Good Health & Well-being**: Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages. Projects would include public health and safety, nutritional education, utilizing technology/3D printing for improved health services, or providing education/products/access to refrigerated foods or to materials/tools to provide safe cooking options.
- **Goal 4 – Quality Education**: Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all.
- **Goal 5 – Gender Equality**: Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls. Also includes any projects working with female entrepreneurs or workforce development for women.
- **Goal 6 – Clean Water & Sanitation**: Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all.
- **Goal 7 – Affordable & Clean Energy**: Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern.

energy for all. May also include projects taking small steps toward renewable/sustainable energy use such as solar panel mobile phone chargers or any device(s) substances providing clean, efficient cooking options.

- **Goal 8 – Decent Work & Economic Growth**: Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all. Includes projects working with underprivileged and marginalized people groups.
- **Goal 9 – Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure**: Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation.
- **Goal 10 – Reduced Inequalities**: Reduce inequality within and among countries.
- **Goal 11 – Sustainable Cities and Communities**: Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.
- **Goal 12 – Responsible Consumption & Production**: Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns. Projects could include reducing excess materials used for production or consumption, such as in food industry; utilizing materials for production from generally discarded items (e.g. “Spring Back Recycling”); or creating better, higher quality products which will last longer.
- **Goal 13 – Climate Action**: Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts. Any and all projects having a positive environmental impact, which could include reduced usage of toxic substances, reduced carbon, ozone, or water vapor emissions.
- **Goal 14 – Life Below Water**: Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development.
- **Goal 15 – Life on Land**: Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss.
- **Goal 16 – Peace, Justice & Strong Institutions**: Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels. Projects could include building social networks within communities across ideological or theological beliefs.
- **Goal 17 – Partnerships for the Goals**: Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development.

PROJECT METRICS

- We have removed the Five Livelihood asset categories and replaced it with a simpler three category system: People, Planet, Prosperity.
